

Militia Records

ALBEMARLE COUNTY, VA Militia 1756
Benjamin Denny hired out a horse and furnished provisions in connection with the French and Indian War Years 1754-1763. The colony of Virginia passed an act in October 1765 to pay for the expenses incurred during the war. (By now the land that Benjamin lived on had been cut off into Amherst County.) Benjamin Denny of Amherst County was paid 14 shillings for the horse and provisions. William Cabell was one of the commissioners appointed to examine the accounts and fix the payments for Amherst Co. (*Laws of Virginia*, Chapter XXIII)

ALBEMARLE COUNTY, VA militia records 1758
In 1765 the House of Burgesses passed an act to pay for the expenses incurred by the colony during the French and Indian War. In Albemarle county the expenses included William Cabell, jun to pay militia Sept 8, 1758 and Philip Henson, Mathew Mullins, Langsdon Depriest, John Depriest and John Rucker. (A John Depriest was involved in a land sale with Benjamin Denny in Amherst County in 1767. The land was on Ruckers Run.)
