

EVALINE ROLLINGS DENNEY HARRIS SMITH COUNTY, TENNESSEE

(Loose Wills, Smith County, Tennessee, Smith County Archives, also recorded in Smith County, Tennessee Will Book B, p. 474.)

I the undersigned, being old and feble [sic] and knowing "life be uncertain and Death sure;" Being in a sound state of mind and fully conscious of what I am about to commit, do make and set forth the following Will and Testament of my property and Earthly effects to be distributed, appostioned [?] and assigned after my death to the following named persons, they being my bodily heirs exclusive of all my just debts if there should be any, including medical services and Burial expenses. Then I will James Denney one dollar Wyatt Denney one dollar and Mary Rollins one dollar and the rest or remainder to be equally divided among the following: Eliza A. Hubbard, Sallie Harrison, and Caroline Allison with the exception of the latter, Caroline Allison, her share to be one hundred Dollars less than either of the two former provided my estate is worth enough to make that deduction and not cut her off, otherwise I will her Fifty dollars after the division. I also decree that in case Eliza Hubbard die without bodily heirs or her her interest derived from my estate shall be heired Equally by her two sister, Sallie Harrison and Caroline Allison. Further, Sallie Harrison's interest is to be used for her exclusive benefit, economically and not prodigally administered and in case that her part of the land should be sold, then the effect be put into other land and the same not to be sold until after the death of her and her Husband, Pleas, Harrison, then to be divided among her bodily heirs.

The foregoing article is my last Will and Testament not to be changed without my consent. Note. I do not cut off any of my children through malice or dislike but solely because they have already received their part during my life time.
