Antrim Parish

1700's

Halifax County was created in 1752 as well as Antrim Parish from Lunenburg County/Cumberland Parish. Among the members of the original vestry of Antrim that lived in what later became Camden Parish with the creation of Pittsylvania County: Thomas Callaway, Thomas Dillard, James Dillard, John Donelson, Peter Wilson, Samuel Harris, Hugh Innes, and Archibald Gordon. Thomas and James Dillard were from King and Queen County and settled on Straightstone Creek. James was Captain of a Company in the French and Indian War. John Donelson lived on the Bannister River. (Maude Carter Clement). The early records of Antrim Parish were destroyed by a fire. (Maude Carter Clement. "Antrim Parish, Halifax County: 1752-1767.")
