



Meeting at Punch Springs on May 15, 1753, with William Wynne, Peter Fontaine, Jr, Hugh Moore, Andrew Wade, and Sherwood Walton, justices present.

A Grand Jury was impaneled as follows: John bates, foreman, John Kerby, Edward Parker, William Lawson, Edmund Floyd, Hance Henrick, Robert Wilkins, Robert Moore, Francis Kerby, Peter Wilson, William Armstrong, Daniel Green, Daniel Smith, Richard Dudgeon, John Hanna, David Lawson, and Alexander Irwin; and they present Benjamin Abbot for assault and battery, John Hickey for concealing tithables; Thomas Brimmon the same, Patrick Boyd the same, William Garrot the same, John Boyd the same, Evan Evans the same, James Boyd the same, John DENNY the same, Francis Brandon the same, David Grymes the same, Chas Hickey the same, John Cannaday for rash and profane swearing on information of Edward Parker, Daniel Green and John Hanna, Richard Witt and Mary Kimbro for living in adultery on information of Hance Hendrick, Edmond Floyd and William Armstrong; George Weir and Sarah Sizemore for living in adultery by I nformation of Hance Hendrick and Daniel Green; Henry Sizemore and Elizabeth Rodes for living in adultery by information of Edward Parker, Hance Hendrick and Daniel Green; also the following for not listing tithables: James Bobbit 2, William Hodges 1, James Hodges 1, George Weir 2, Thomas Ellyson 3, John Stovall 3, John Morrison 2, James Paty 2, James Payne 2, David Stevens and William Stevens for not listing themselves each 1 tithable. They also find that the Matters of Fact laid to the charge of James Caldwell agst Hugh Moore Gent., one of his Majestys Justices of the Pease, in abusing him in a profane and gross manner are Matters of Fact. Also agst James Cary for rash and profane swearing by information of Daniel Green, Edward Parker and John Kerby; Robert Sims for like offence by information of Peter Wilson, Robert Wilkins and Edward Parker; Jasper Billing and John Billing for concealing each 1 tithable; Nathaniel Terry, Gent. For taking a stray horse and riding him contrary to law by information of Joseph Mays and John Gillingtine. Nothing further being offered, they are discharged.
