1860

SLAVE CENSUS

The 1860 Census also recorded the name of every slave owner and the number of slaves he owned. As in the 1850 Census, although the names of the slaves were not included, it did include the age and sex of each slave, as well as whether they were black or mulatto, whether there were any fugitive slaves out of state from the farm and whether any of the slaves were deaf or dumb. Additionally, the census of 1860 recorded whether any of the slaves had been immunized in the last year. In addition to this, the Census of 1850 recorded whether or not there were separate slave houses and how many on each farm.

Isaiah Winfree age 3 black slave born in Tennessee died in January burnt [sic]

As Allen Winfree was the only Winfree slave holder in Smith County in 1860 it is reasonable to suppose, that this young man was a slave in the household of Allen Winfree and that he died as the results of a fire.
